Houston Food Bank Student Heroes

Through the HFB Student Heroes program, High school students receive training and learn core principles of leadership while taking a role in volunteer-based projects.

Eligibility: Any current 9th – 11th grade student who is interested in long-term volunteer work during the SUMMER (June – August)

Deadline: 1st week of MAY

Requirements:

- Must commit to completing 50 volunteer hours during the semester
- Must commit to completing 4 shifts per month

Deadline: April 13










Summer Writing Institute

The Summer Writing Institute at Rhodes College is a residential academic program committed to developing the critical thinking and writing skills of high school students. Within the college's liberal arts environment, students sharpen their reading and analytical skills and learn strategies for writing creatively and critically. At the end of the session, students receive a grade for their work and class participation, earn two college credits (transferable to most colleges and universities), and will complete a portfolio of college-level writing.



Eligibility: Current 9th - 11th grade students interested in improving their writing, analytical or creative skills

Cost: \$2,400



Dates: June 11 – 23



Summer High School Studio Art Intensive

• Session 2: Equality and Human Development - July 17 - 21


